## NEWS HASI:

17 February 2020. AEA complained to the Equality & Human Rights Commission (EHRC) about unlawful statements in its guidance on the 2010 Equality Act. After prolonged correspondence, EHRC corrected its guidance in July and Aug 2020.

**6 May 2021.** AEA's High Court Hearing. Permission for a Judicial Review of EHRC not granted. However, in order to defend itself, EHRC was forced to publicly make significant clarifications and concessions, stating that:

- People with a Gender Recognition Certificate can be lawfully excluded from single-sex services
- A policy which states that trans persons must be allowed access to the singlesex services of their choice is directly inconsistent with the law
- It has informed some organisations that their policies are unlawful and will do the same with other organisations that come to its attention
- EHRC isn't responsible for service-providers' unlawful policies and that complainants should take legal action against service providers

**20 May 2021**. Barrister Akua Reindorf's Report for Essex University published.

The Report stated that Stonewall's advice to the university did not comply with the Equality Act. A Times article reports Liz Ward, Stonewall's Director of Programmes, saying, in reference to AEA's 6 May Hearing, that:

"Our advice on the Equality Act is based on guidance provided by the Equality and Human Rights Commission, which was recently reaffirmed in the High Court"

**23 May 2021**. EHRC reveals that it has withdrawn from Stonewall's Diversity Champions scheme.

**28 May 2021**. ACAS reveals that it is no longer a Stonewall Diversity Champion.

**29 May 2021**. The Telegraph reports more departures from the scheme: House of Commons Driver & Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) Dorset Police Ministry of Housing and Local Government.

**31 May 2021**. Secretary of State, Liz Truss calls on the 250 government departments that are Stonewall Diversity Champions to quit the scheme.

These are precarious times for organisations.
